The "corridor" is defined as the entire tidal section of the Anacostia River in DC, reaching from the river channel to the upland edge of the 500-year flood plan.





- Project Period: May 2021 mid 2024









Nature/wildlife appreciation	152
Using the trails along the river (walking, biking, running)	147
Kayaking/Canoeing	143
Visiting parks along the river	116
Picnic or other social gatherings	113
Other Boating (Sailing etc.)	72
Fishing	65
Rowing	65
Other	38





99% of responses ranked cleanliness of the river as the most important factor in deciding to participate in river-based activities, with **nature and wildlife habitat** as the next highest rank factor.

Security and safety, health and fitness opportunities, and scenic beauty were the next highest ranked factors to participating in river-based activities.

49% or more of all respondents noted the following as high priority for immediate attention:

- Reducing litter & pollution
- Reducing flood risks
- Improving fish and wildlife habitat
- Improving safety and security

50% of all respondents noted the following a medium priority to make a positive impact:

- Improving scenic quality
- Improved recreational options & availability
- Improved access to recreation





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

Restoration and SW Management Strategies

- Stream daylighting/restoration
- Living shoreline restoration (tidal wetlands & submerged aquatic vegetation)
- Upland wetland restoration
- Reforestation and meadow riparian plantings
- Stormwater Best Management Practices
- Mussel Restoration

Public Access and Recreation

- Increased Birdwatching/wildlife viewing
- Enhanced Bike / Ped connections
- Enhanced Gathering Spaces
- Enhanced Overlooks
- Picnic Areas
- Put-ins for water recreation/access (small craft)
- Swimming
- Increased Fishing spots





Phase 2: Program and Operational Considerations

Anacostia River Corridor Restoration Plan

Program/ Activities

- Keep it natural/wild river amenity preserved for adjacent communities, public health
- Swim safety education
- Curated bike rides and nature activities and tours on land and water; guided hikes in winter too
- Volunteer events
- Connect communities to grant resources and emergency
 preparedness
- Paddleboats, rentals/shares
- Increase job/training opportunities
- Grills near adjacent communities

Access & Circulation

- Put-ins for kayak/canoe/paddleboards
- Equity in transit infrastructure and access points
- Free parking
- More paths and improved access for adjacent communities
- Access across the river
- Universal access

Navigation

- Seawall removal; address steep banks
- Dredging for access; Hazard removal
- Freespan bridges to support boat access



Education / Acknowledgment

- Stories/history of the river embedded in experience signage and programs, Black and Indigenous stories highlighted
- Nature signage and increased programs
- Encourage traditions
- Engage with "Friends of" groups

Management & Maintenance

- Increase maintenance of trails/trash receptacle and parks facilities
- Trash collection/ cleanups/ education / traps
- Trail and road condition improvements
- Invasive species management

Amenities & Safety

- Lighting improved
- Security phones / cameras /cell reception
- Water safety stations / throw rings

Operations

- Work through a racial equity lens- equitable distribution of funding along the entire corridor
- Integrate communities into decision-making
- Increase funding for maintenance and management
- Policies to avoid displacement / gentrification




